Title: Therapist, Safe Program

Hours: Full Time (37.5 hours, non-exempt position)

Brief Description:

This position carries a clinical case load in the Mental Health & Safe Counseling Program providing mental assessment, diagnosis and treatment, and counseling services. As a Safe Program clinician, services focus on families throughout the adoption spectrum including: families in the process of adoptions; attachment interventions with families to prevent disrupted foster and adoptive placements; and individual counseling for emerging adults aging out of foster care, or with adoptive histories, experiencing challenges related to healthy relationship and identity formation.

KEY RESPONSIBILITY AREA MAIN DUTIES (Not all inclusive)

Clinical counseling services to clients in the Safe Program and general mental health services

- Provides direct counseling services to clients in the Safe Program and general mental health services within department productivity standard goal of 75% (billed for service/scheduled for service).
- Provides clinically competent services in assessment, treatment plan development, diagnosis/assessment, and ongoing therapeutic services.
- Demonstrate a comprehensive knowledge of psychotherapeutic interventions, especially in relation to attachment and post-adoption supports.
- In coordination with Manager, provides Safe clinical services including counseling and intensives

Service Coordination

- Engage in outreach to community organizations to develop referral network for Safe Program services.
- Provide case management coordination, when necessary, for continuity of care in service provision for complex clinical cases.
- Maintains knowledge of community resources, especially in regard to adoption and foster care.

Documentation and Quality Assurance

- Completes documentation within clinically appropriate time frames to meet billing standards.
- Participates in peer record reviews and maintains agency standards for documentation.
- Maintains electronic case files and effectively utilizes records management software.
- Compiles data and statistics as requested and required for monitoring of services

Teamwork, professional growth, and other duties as assigned

- Appropriately completes assignments as requested in a timely manner.
- Maintains and develops relevant skills in trauma informed care, attachment therapy, and other areas related to practice.
- Works collaboratively with Manager and partners for effective service delivery.

Minimum Requirements:

- Master's in Social Work;
- LSW, LISW preferred
- Clinical experience
- Knowledge of child welfare issues
- Ability to collaborate with other therapists, service providers, and community service organizations for building referral base and other collaborative services
- Ability to plan and coordinate services
- Ability to effectively work with other organizations in the community
- Ability to work with diverse populations
- Willingness to work flexible hours
- Valid Ohio Driver's license and access to dependable transportation
- Commitment to CSSMV's mission and goals
- Knowledge of Catholic teachings and/or ability to acquire and function within that framework
