Another Bias Training... with a Twist

Meets Supervision Requirement

This workshop will provide a different perspective to bias training that combines real-life personal experiences with the Three Minded Theory—*Reasonable, Emotional, and Wise Mind*—to describe a person's thoughts and behaviors. This training combines the use of DBT with unconscious biases that include subconscious thoughts, beliefs, and stereotypes. Once we recognize and admit our biases, we will learn how to process them through the use of the Three Minded Theory. This combination will allow participants to learn how to move from emotional and reasonable mind to the desired wise mind.

Presenters: Joanna White, MSW, LISW-S, Associate Director of Family Services, specializes in working with those experiencing traumatic symptoms due to a variety of reasons and working with a diverse population including those who have experienced criminal justice involvement. Amy Piner, BA, has experience with organizational management, curriculum development, and working with an extremely diverse population to include those who have experience criminal justice involvement.

Postpartum

Approximately 70% to 80% of women will experience, at a minimum, the 'baby blues.' Many of these women will experience the more severe condition of postpartum depression or a related condition. This training will provide information on perinatal mood disorders, causes, prevention and management strategies, and different tools clinicians can utilize with clients.
